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Sunshine Cottage Continues to Shine during Challenging Times



On August 11, we opened the doors virtually to just under 200 children from Early Childhood to 5th grade. Another 110 children ages birth to three are enrolled in our Parent Infant Program. Sunshine Cottage is serving a record number of children this year. On September 8, we opened the doors to families who selected face-to-face instruction, and we are currently seeing almost 100 students daily. It is a true blessing to have students back on campus and to hear the joy of little ones learning.

The COVID-19 protocols we have in place allow for a safe and secure environment for staff and students. I want to thank

parents and grandparents for honoring our request to protect everyone by not entering the building. Your patience each morning as we check temperatures and wash hands is appreciated. Team members have gone above and beyond what is requested without hesitation to serve our children. Sunshine Cottage Teacher Presents at an Alexander Graham Bell Symposium

Recently, Sunshine Cottage Preschool
Teacher Sarah Carpenter presented a
session at the Alexander Graham Bell
Global Listening and Spoken Language
Symposium along with renowned deaf
educator, Carol Flexer. The session was
titled, "How to Engage Preschoolers Using
Chapter Books."

The session was presented virtually to
Listening & Spoken Language Specialists,
Deaf Educators, Speech Pathologists,
Audiologists and parents from around the
globe. The purpose of the session
was to demonstrate the importance
of introducing and reading chapter
books aloud to three-year-old
children who are deaf or hard of
hearing. By the end of the session,
attendees were able to organize
a list of chapter books that would
be appropriate for preschoolers,
explain the process

explain the process of introducing chapter books, and describe how chapter books can be used to teach continuity and sequencing of a story over time.

Reading aloud is an important developmental

step because it raises grade-level competence in literacy, which is a desired outcome for all children.

Carpenter said, "It was an honor to not only present with Carol Flexer but also to have planning sessions with her each week leading up to the presentation. This was valuable time to discuss our current project while also being able to pick Carol's brain about topics ranging from deaf education to the current climate of our world." Carpenter hopes that the techniques she and others have learned over the last several months can help teachers continue to reach families of deaf or hard of hearing children across the country and even the world. There are many families in need of tele-therapy who are not able to access it. "I hope these families will benefit working together with specialists in the field to help their children and loved ones succeed."

Carpenter is currently teaching her preschool class virtually. She loved working with families and their children when virtual learning was mandatory and continues to enjoy it now that it is an option. She is continuously reminded how hard Sunshine Cottage families work each day to promote listening and spoken language for their children. Being able to coach parents not only in weekly sessions but also daily morning message or during language activities, is truly inspiring. Children are with their parents so many more hours than they are at school. She appreciates that this is a time unlike any other where she can also really coach parents five days a week. "It's September and I have already coached a few families on the benefit of reading chapter books and that topic usually is not discussed until the spring."

Helping across the World

Our founder believed that if given the opportunity, children who are born deaf or hard of hearing could learn to listen and talk and live a full, self-reliant life. The Sunshine Cottage professionals constantly work to fulfill Mrs. White's dream in many areas, one of which is the development and publication of numerous educational resources, particularly the The Cottage Acquisition Scales for Listening, Language and Speech (CASLLS). CASLLS was first published in 1999 and gave professionals a developmental roadmap for learning listening and spoken language. A few years ago, an electronic

The Welcome Home Foundation Inc. is a nonprofit organization in the Philippines with a mission to help children who are deaf or hard of hearing. Within the Welcome Home Foundation, children in need can benefit from their Educational Resource Center and Literacy Program, both providing individualized instruction and speech and hearing services. Jill Smith, a speech-language pathologist from Australia, volunteered her time to work with the teachers at the educational resource center on how best to teach speech and language to children who are deaf or hard of hearing. Many of the children had no prior schooling before the age of 5 and were lacking in proper audiological equipment. After much research, the CASLLS was believed to be the perfect tool to help them. Smith reached out to Sunshine Cottage for help, and we were happy to assist with the eCASLLS and the Speech That Works App, another tool developed by Sunshine Cottage professionals targeted to improve phoneme production.

As the Welcome Home Foundation acquires more technology for their students and teachers, Sunshine Cottage will continue to offer complimentary subscriptions to the eCASLLS and Speech That Works. By using these tools, teachers in the Philippines continue to monitor the progress of language and speech acquisition of the deaf and hard of hearing students in their programs. Smith contacted Sunshine Cottage again to express her gratitude on behalf of the Welcome Home Foundation and share some stories of success. Today, Mrs. White's vision has expanded beyond the halls of Sunshine Cottage and continues to shine all over the world.
